2. Finding out the animal's microchip number and requesting that the microchip company contact the registered owner can be done at most shelters and veterinary offices. Finding out where the animal was microchipped can also lead to finding the animal's owner as they should have their contact information on file.
3. Reporting the animal as lost in the county that the animal was found will increase the chances that the animal's owner will find them.

5. Share the pet's photo on social media pages with important information such as identifying marks and where they were found. Use the above questionnaire as a guide for identifying important information. HSCC as well as other rescue groups require proof of ownership. This is something that you can request before handing off the pet to ensure that the animal goes back to their proper home. Examples include photographs, vet records, adoption papers, or county license.
